The name Trismegistus means thrice-greatest, and is the title given by the Greeks to the Egyptian god Thoth or Tehuti, a lord of wisdom and learning. Surviving Hermes Trismegistus is the wisdom of the Hermetica, 42 books that have profoundly influenced the development of Western magic.
