Pirate Gold Sought in Maryland

Legends have circulated for years about Blondbeard, the famous privateer who terrorized colonists in the years after the Revolutionary War. A local team of treasure hunters believe that they have pinpointed the spot where the ship sank in 1781.

Until now, divers have been unsuccessful at salvage attempts due to the depth of the wreck. However, a local financier, Thaddeus Q. Lynch, has now stepped up to back the operation. Lynch, a self-described "amateur archaeologist," has financed several similar hunts in the past. His funding will allow the team to use the latest diving gear, as well as an experimental device called a "bathysphere," to explore the depths of the Maryland coast.
